Resident Profile: Meet Soren Peder Ogaard

Soren Ogaard, who has been a resident since May 2018, has a story of accomplishments.

Born in Esbjerg, Denmark where he received his early education, Soren went on to Niels Brock University in Copenhagen, graduating with a degree in Business Management and Administration. Upon graduation, he apprenticed in retail fabric for a department store in Esbjerg, Denmark. Then in 1955, at the suggestion of a friend, he moved to Oslo, Norway and became an Assistant Buyer in an import and wholesale fabric company, selling wool fabric to tailors across the country.

As happens to all young people in Scandinavia, his career was interrupted in 1957 by a call up to do 3 years of compulsory service in the Danish Army. Fortunately, Denmark was at peace, so he didn't experience combat. Upon discharge, Soren was appointed Trade Commissioner for the Royal Danish Consulate in Bristol, England to oversee trade inquiries between Denmark and businesses throughout the southwestern part of England. It was during this time, that he met and married his first wife. Soren became an instant father to his wife's daughters. He enjoyed fatherhood so much that in a couple of years, three more children joined the family.

In 1962, Soren and his family moved to Canada, where Soren founded Danesco of Canada with a business partner in Montreal, an importing wholesale business dealing in furniture and kitchenware for department stores, institutions and retailers nationwide. As Vice President, Soren travelled extensively throughout Europe and other destinations on buying missions.

Soren negotiated his largest contract valued at 30 million in early 60's to furnish the new student union building in Alberta, the total length of the fabric ran more than 20 kilometers.

When this partnership ended on good terms, he started another company, Gabriel Textiles, which imported high quality furnishing textiles for architects



and furniture manufacturers. In this capacity Soren frequently exhibited products at international design shows, where he was so successful that he won 'best display' two years in a row.

Armed with these experiences and looking for a new challenge, Soren went on to spend the last 25 years of his working career partnering with his sons, Peder and Eric, doing home and commercial renovations; a work he enjoyed so much that he continued until age 80, retiring only when stricken with a stroke and heart attack.

Although Soren's career occupied much of his life, he has been very much a family man. Between his first and second marriage, he became responsible for raising a total of ten children; for many years, as a single parent.

Having come from a country close to the sea, Soren's favorite hobby has been sail boat racing. Soon after arriving in Canada he became a member of the Royal St. Lawrence Yacht Club in Montreal, where he enjoyed sail boat racing his 35 ft sloop in Montreal and surrounding areas going as far as Quebec City and Murray Bay. Soren was accompanied by his children on his sailing adventures.

At Union Villa, Soren loves to talk with residents and family members, and participates in many activities. He has a great sense of humour, and isn't afraid to speak his mind.


